



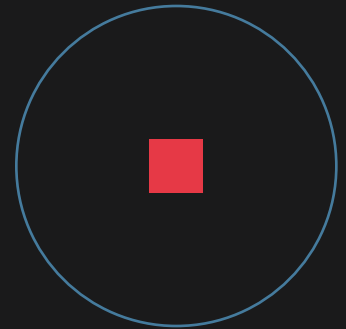

ANTONYMS

Antonyms (विलोम शब्द) ऐसे शब्द होते हैं जिनका अर्थ किसी अन्य शब्द के विपरीत या उल्टा होता है। उदाहरण के लिये, Happy का विलोम शब्द Sad है।

विलोम शब्द भाषा को समृद्ध बनाने, लेखन और बोलचाल में स्पष्टता लाने और विचारों की तुलना (Contrast) करने में मदद करते हैं।

महत्त्व

- **स्पष्टता बढ़ाना:** विलोम शब्द विचारों की तुलना और विरोधाभास को प्रभावी रूप से प्रस्तुत करते हैं।
- **शब्दावली समृद्ध करना:** विलोम शब्द का अभ्यास आपकी शब्दावली को विस्तृत और प्रभावशाली बनाता है।
- **पाठ समझने में सहायता:** विलोम शब्दों का ज्ञान आपको संदर्भ (Context) को बेहतर ढंग से समझने में मदद करता है।

उदाहरण:

नीचे कुछ सामान्य विलोम शब्दों के उदाहरण दिये गए हैं, जो इस अवधारणा को स्पष्ट करते हैं:

Fast (तेज़)	Slow (धीमा)
Happy (खुश)	Sad (उदास)
Bright (चमकदार)	Dull (मंद)
Large (बड़ा)	Small (छोटा)
Strong (मजबूत)	Weak (कमज़ोर)

संदर्भ का महत्त्व

Context (संदर्भ) विलोम शब्दों के चयन में बहुत महत्वपूर्ण भूमिका निभाता है। सही विलोम शब्द चुनने के लिये इस बात पर ध्यान देना ज़रूरी है कि वह वाक्य में कैसे प्रयोग हो रहा है।

उदाहरण के लिये

Hard का विलोम शब्द Soft (मुलायम) हो सकता है जब यह "Hard Surface" के लिये उपयोग किया गया हो, लेकिन Easy (आसान) हो सकता है जब "Hard Question" के संदर्भ में इस्तेमाल किया गया हो।
