

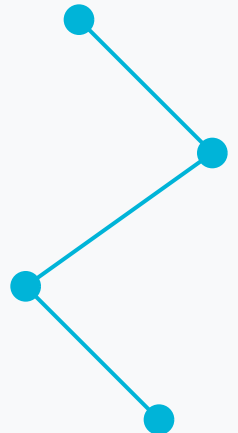

SYNONYMS

Synonyms (समानार्थी शब्द) ऐसे शब्द होते हैं जिनका अर्थ समान या लगभग समान होता है। उदाहरण के लिए, happy और joyful समानार्थी शब्द हैं।

समानार्थी शब्द शब्दावली को समृद्ध करते हैं, लेखन शैली में सुधार करते हैं, और भाषण व लेखन में Repetition से बचने में मदद करते हैं। **उदाहरण:** इस अवधारणा को स्पष्ट करने के लिए कुछ सरल उदाहरण दिए गए हैं, जैसे-

Fast – Quick, Speedy, Rapid, Swift

Happy – Joyful, Cheerful, Content, Delighted

किसी चर्चा के दौरान संदर्भ (Context) समानार्थी शब्दों का चयन करते समय बहुत महत्वपूर्ण होता है, क्योंकि सभी समानार्थी शब्द हर स्थिति में एक-दूसरे के स्थान पर उपयोग नहीं किए जा सकते। उदाहरण के लिए, Childish और Childlike समान हैं लेकिन उनके अर्थ अलग-अलग हैं।
