Numbers and Letters Series

In this chapter, a series of some digits/numbers or groups of letters is given. This series is based on a certain pattern in which the next term or any missing term has to be found, which is based on the same pattern on which the other terms of the series are based.

The main purpose of series based questions is to test the student's ability to calculate quickly and to check his/her ability to determine the relationship between different letters. Series based questions can be divided into the following categories.

1. Digit/number series
2. Alphabet series
3. Miscellaneous/Mixed Series

Class 1. Rupee, Digit/Number Series (Number System)

In the questions asked in digit/number series, a series of digits is given, in which various mathematical operations are inherent. These operations may include addition, subtraction, multiplication, division, square, square root, cube, cube root etc. One term is missing in the series and the student has to find out which term out of given options. For example-

1. 1, 4, 9, 16, 25, 36

The series represents the squares of consecutive natural numbers.

2. 2, 3, 5, 7, 11, 13, 17, 19

The series shows consecutive prime numbers starting from 2.

To find the missing term in a given series, first we have to identify the rule on which the series is based. The following points can be helpful in identifying that rule-

- If the digits or numbers of the series are increasing at a simple rate, then it is a series based on addition.
- If the digits or numbers of the series are decreasing at a simple rate then it is a series based on subtraction.
- If the numbers in the series are increasing very rapidly, then multiplication is definitely taking place. (or square or any positive power) Apart from this, addition or subtraction can also take place simultaneously.
- If the digits of the series are decreasing rapidly, then division can be done here. Along with this, subtraction can also be done.
- If the series increases rapidly at first and then decreases, then multiplication and division are being done respectively.

- If the value of digits in a series first increases and then decreases, but with a small difference, then the operations of addition and subtraction might be going on alternately. Many types of questions are asked on digit/number series in various competitive examinations. For understanding these questions, we can divide them into the following types.

Type-1: Completing a series

In this type of questions, one term in the series is left blank or represented by a question mark (?) and then we are asked to choose the appropriate option in place of the blank term or the term represented by a question mark.

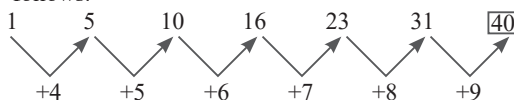
Example:

1. Which number will come in place of question mark (?) in the given digit/number series?

1, 5, 10, 16, 23, 31, ?

Sol. On carefully observing the given number series, it is found that the series is increasing in the order of +4, +5, +6, +7, +8, +9 which can be easily understood as follows.



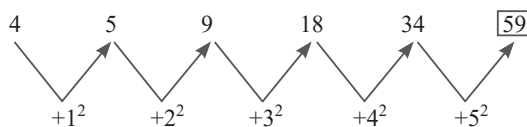
Hence, the appropriate number to come in place of the question mark would be '40'.

Sol. On carefully observing the given series, we find that the series is formed by adding the squares of natural numbers, which are as follows-



Hence, the appropriate number that will come in place of the question mark will be '59'.

Type-2: Finding the wrong term in a given number series

In such questions, a wrong term is written in place of the correct number at any place in the given digit/number series. We have to find the correct term by finding the pattern given in the series. To solve such questions, first of all we should find the fixed pattern of the series and know which term of the series is not following that rule, this required term is the wrong term.

1. Which term is wrong in the below given series?

2, 4, 8, 3, 10, 27, 4, 16, 64

- (1) 8 (2) 10

Sol. On carefully observing the given number series, it is known that the series starts from 2 and progresses in the form of its square and cube, which can be easily understood as follows—

2	4	8	3	10	27	4	16	64
↓	↓	↓	↓	↓	↓	↓	↓	↓
2 ¹	2 ²	2 ³	3 ¹	3 ²	3 ³	4 ¹	4 ²	4 ³

So 10 is a wrong term, because there should be $3^2 = 9$
So the correct option is (2).

Sol. On observing the given series, it is found that the series is obtained by adding natural numbers and their squares respectively, which can be easily understood as follows—

1 ² +1	2 ² +2	3 ² +3	4 ² +4	5 ² +5	6 ² +6	7 ² +7

Clearly '40' is a wrong term, because there should be $6^2 + 6 = 42$. So option (1) is correct.

Type-3: Finding hierarchy in category based questions

Looking at the changing pattern of various examinations being conducted at present, there is a possibility of asking questions based on categories, which are generally of two types—

1. Arithmetic Progression

The series in which the difference between two consecutive terms is the same is called the 'parallel series'. In any parallel series, the number obtained by subtracting the previous term from a term is called the 'difference'. If the first term of a parallel series is 'a' and the difference is 'd', then the parallel series will be as follows—

$a, (a + d), (a + 2d), (a + 3d), \dots$

'n'th term of an arithmetic progression,

$$T_n = a + (n - 1)d$$

Where a = first term and d = common difference

Questions related to arithmetic progression can be understood with the help of given examples.

1. What will be the 10th term of the series 7, 9, 11, 13,?

Sol. first term $a = 7$

common difference $d = 9 - 7 = 2$

10th term (T_{10}) = ?

$$T_n = a + (n - 1)d$$

$$T_{10} = 7 + (10 - 1)2$$

$$T_{10} = 25$$

2. If the first term of an arithmetic progression is 6, the common difference is 3 and the last term is 81, then find the number of terms and choose the appropriate option.

Sol. Here, $a = 6, d = 3, T_n = 81, n = ?$

$$T_n = a + (n - 1)d$$

$$81 = 6 + (n - 1)3$$

$$\Rightarrow (n - 1) = \frac{81 - 6}{3} = \frac{75}{3} = 25$$

$$\Rightarrow n = 25 + 1 = 26$$

Hence, no. of terms $n = 26$

2. Geometric Progression

Geometric series is a series in which the ratio of two consecutive terms is the same. This ratio is called the 'common ratio' of the geometric series, it is obtained by dividing a term by its previous term. For example, if the terms of a geometric series are $t_1, t_2, t_3, t_4, \dots, t_n$ respectively, then the common

ratio is $= \frac{t_2}{t_1} = \frac{t_3}{t_2} = \frac{t_4}{t_3} = \frac{t_n}{t_{n-1}}$. If the first term of a geometric

series is 'a' and the common ratio is 'r', then the n th term of that geometric series will be $T_n = ar^{n-1}$. Geometric series related questions can be easily understood with the help of given examples.

Example. Which of the following will be the 9th term of the series 2, 4, 8, 16, 32, 64?

- (1) 256 (2) 128
(3) 512 (4) 488

Sol. Here, first term $a = 2$ and

$$\text{common ratio } r = 2 \left(\because \frac{4}{2}, \frac{8}{4} = 2 \right)$$

$$9\text{th term} = 2 \times 2^8 = 2 \times 2^8 = 512$$

Therefore, option (3) will be correct.

Class 2. Alphabet Series

The alphabet series is also called the letter series. In this, mainly a series of letters or groups of letters of the English alphabet is given, in which a question mark (?) is indicated at one place or one or more letters are left. The alphabet series is mainly based on alphabet arrangement. To easily solve questions related to alphabet series, it is very important to remember the serial numbers of the English alphabet such as A = 1, B = 2, C = 3 ... X = 24, Y = 25, and Z = 26.

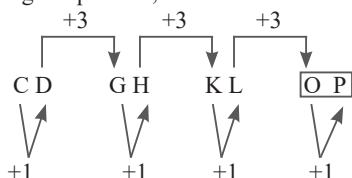

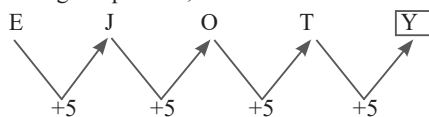

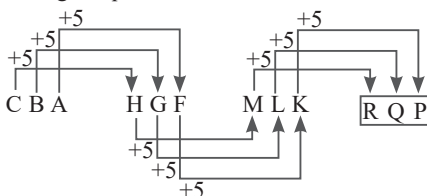

Class-3: Miscellaneous/Mixed Series

Under the miscellaneous or mixed series, those types of questions are included which are not included in the number or letter series or the questions are obtained by mixing the questions of number and letter series. The following types of questions are included under the miscellaneous series.

Type-1: Diagram Based Questions

In such questions, numbers or letters are filled in a diagram following a particular rule and the place of one or some numbers is left empty. We have to find the number/letter to be filled in this empty place i.e. the missing term. This type of questions can be easily understood with the help of given examples.

1. What will be the missing number in the given diagram, which is shown by a question mark?

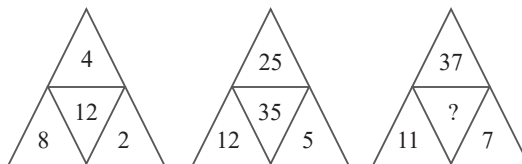

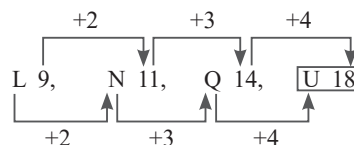
Type 2: Alphabet-digit mixed series

In this type of questions, there is a series of numbers and letters mixed together, in which the missing number is found in place of question mark (?) based on the relation between the letters and numbers. For example—

Example. L 9, N 11, Q 14, ?

Therefore option (1) is correct.

Type 3: Frequency series of letters/digits

In this type of questions, alphabets or numbers appear repeatedly after a certain sequence and form a series of letters, in which one or two numbers/letters are missing in the middle or at the end, which the candidates have to find out. For example—

Example: 035478035478035478? ?

Sol. On observing the given series, it is found that '035478' is coming repeatedly. Hence the next two digits will be '03'. Hence option (1) is correct.
